# Class I and 2

Year I have had a busy start to the Spring term. In Literacy the children have written a letter of advice to Rabbit using adjectives and contractions to improve their work. In Numeracy the children have practically grouped numbers in to groups of tens and ones to partition numbers to 50. During Science the children named everyday materials and discussed what they are used for. In Geography the children looked at the differences between the town and the countryside, identifying key features. To finish the week the children enjoyed a ball skills session in PE.

Year 2 have made a fantastic start to the Spring term. This week they have finished writing their leaflets about protecting the earth. They used questions, commands, exclamations and statements in their leaflet and used the conjunctions so that, in order to and because to extend their sentences. They discussed small



changes they could make to protect endangered animals and help to save the world. In Numeracy the children have continued their work on 2D shape, sorting shapes in to groups using Venn diagrams and finding vertical lines of symmetry on shapes. They have started to name and describe 3D shapes using their faces, vertices and edges. During Science the children named and identified everyday materials and objects that are made of them. In Grography they started their new topic 'Weather' and looked at how it changes during each season of the year



# Class 3 and 4

In numeracy we've been developing our understanding of multiplication by diving into the world of column multiplication. Students are learning to multiply 2-digit numbers by I-digit numbers with confidence, using this essential skill in a range of problem-solving activities. In literacy we've embarked on a magical journey through Helen Ward's captivating book, "The Tin Forest." This beautifully illustrated story has sparked lively discussions about environmental issues and the importance of nature. In our literacy lessons, we've been focusing on mastering different verb tenses (simple past, perfect present, and present). Students are learning

to use these tenses accurately in their writing, making their stories and descriptions more vivid and engaging. Our French lessons have been centred around the theme of "Je Peux," allowing students to express their abilities and interests in the French language. They've been practicing vocabulary related to daily activities and hobbies. In Religious Education, we've begun an introduction to the Islamic faith. Students are learning about key beliefs and practices of Islam, fostering respect and understanding of different religions. Year 4 have had a thrilling, busy first week back. In PE we took part in 'Restart the Heart' training. The children were enthusiastic and engaged. They thoroughly enjoyed the practical aspect of practising compressions on a dummy. The children were also amazing at remembering the DRS ABCD if they were ever to witness an accident; Danger, response, shout, airway, breathing, compressions and dial 999. In literacy we started a new book called 'Winter's Child'. Instantly we recognised the illustrator of this book is the same as our previous book 'Farther'. In maths we have continued to learn about multiplication and division. This week we have focussed on factors and factor pairs. In PE on Friday, we worked as teams to invent our own ball skills games. We had to create rules, write down a list of equipment that we needed and instructions that would be easy for another child to follow. We are excited to teach our classmates these games next week; hide ball seek, elemental tag and indoor sprint hockey.
